

# Valentina's Story

Every day is the same for me. The only way I know that the morning comes is when I hear the birds singing, and the dark night becomes a grey day.

The first voice I hear is my daughter Eliza. She comes in the morning so that I can go to the toilet, taking me by hand to lead me. Then she makes the food while I sit. And that is my day, every day. I cannot read, I cannot go walking.

I can only sit, and hear the sounds of life around me. I am afraid to go anywhere - because of my other health problems, I need the toilet often, and so even if I am taken somewhere I am always worried. I have five adult children, I am glad to have them around, but it makes me sad that I am a burden on them.

My daughter cannot live in her own house with her husband because I depend on her. My body is still strong – when I could see, I would make crafts and sell them at the market. But now the

days are filled with waiting, till the grey darkness drains away and the night time comes again.

Sometimes I wish my husband was here to help me, but he died. My name is Valentina, I am 59 years old, and this is my life now.

Valentina's life was transformed when The Fred Hollows Foundation NZ's Pacific Outreach Team arrived in Nuku'alofa, Tonga.

## Your kindness Building a brighter future

#### You make the journey worth it.

For 73-year-old Aminiasi, gaining access to eye care was almost impossible. Advanced Pterygium (tur-id-jee-um), had reduced this once strong farmer and formidable rugby player, to a life of seeing only shadows.

"What I see today, it will be different tomorrow. Every day it gets worse. It has taken my sight."

Aminiasi's physical body had also begun to deteriorate, leaving him completely dependent on his wife Aggie. Together with their paraplegic adult son, they live 2 hours from Suva, and a 4km trek through tropical forest from the main road. This remote location and their lack of funds, meant accessing eye care for Aminiasi's blinding condition was completely out of their reach.

But your support helped to change this! The Mobile Eye Clinic (MEC) came and was stationed close enough to Aminiasi's home, that for the first time, help was within reach.

Aminiasi had to get up at 5am to make the long trek to the main road. His neighbour led him, and paid for the taxi to take him the rest of the journey to the MEC.

On board the MEC, Aminiasi was able to receive sight-restoring surgery and can once again see life beyond the shadows.
